3. Report on academic and other activities in the college since the last meeting of the Governing Body.

Principal explained various academic activities conducted from March 2022 to November 2022, such as

- > Students and faculty presented papers in National/ International conferences and Seminars in other institutions.
- > Faculty members who attended FDP, seminars / workshops and Refresher courses.
- > Research articles publication in peer reviewed journals by the faculty members

- > Sports and Games activities organized in the campus.

4. Examination Results for the academic year 2021-22.

Principal explained the end exam results of B.Tech, MBA, MCA and M.Tech for the academic year 2021-22 (I & II semester).

Ms.D.A.Kalpaja enquired the results of I & II year B.Tech students as the results are poor and instructed to conduct Remedial classes to the students who score below 65% of internal marks. Dr.B.S.Madhukar, UGC Nominee, informed to identify bridge courses and start training and also collect the feedback of previous Analysis in subjects and go for the improvement.

Resolution: The Governing body noted the details and suggested to conduct the Remedial classes for the improvement of the pass percentage of I & II year students in the forthcoming semesters.

5. Report on Admission for the academic year 2022-23.

Principal explained admission status of SITAMS for the academic year 2022-23. The admissions for branches CIVIL, Mechanical and EEE were reduced drastically and increase in demand for CSE related domains. Also explained the issues related to admission process and strategies for improvement of admission for the forth coming academic year.

Ms.D.A.Kalpaja enquired feasibilities of conducting classes for the Civil & Mechanical branches as the strength is poor, Principal explained that, in first year level those students are merged with other branches as the curriculum is common across all branches.

Dr.B.S.Madhukar suggested to Conduct Exhibitions, Innovation and creative cell, Awareness Camps in Various District Headquarters, Hackathons, Scholarship Tests, Games & Sports etc, and suggested to setup small committees to work on this to improve the admissions.

Resolution: The Governing body noted the details and suggested to go for the NAAC for the betterment of Admissions and informed to start the Process.

- ➤ Innovation and Incubation Center, Science and Technology Start-Up Park & Industry-Institute Partnership Center are to be established in the Old Administrative Block. I request the Governing Body to sanction 1.5% of total annual budget of institute.
- ➤ ICT Center is to be established in the Computer Block with necessary Accessories and Advanced Equipments for smooth conducting of Virtual videos by faculty to create SITAMS YouTube channel. So that the students can listen the virtual videos which are available in the Websites.

Resolution: The Governing Body members noted and approved the same for implementation with immediate effect.
